Play Soccer Ghana was established in 2001 as Play Soccer Non Profit International (PSNI) first pilot program and over the years has expanded from a single site with 100 children to 3000 currently benefiting from various project interventions across the country.

Play Soccer Ghana aims at equipping the children with the requisite life skills needed for their healthy development into skilled, capable, educated and responsible adults and thus become agents of change within their communities as well as act as a catalyst for community development on a whole.

Play Soccer Ghana is a member of the Common Goal Community, and Sports for Social Change Network. The organization collaborates with schools, Government ministries and development agencies, and other civil society organizations in the delivery of its interventions

Play Soccer (core) programme uses football as a tool to teach, health, social and football skills to children between the ages of 5-15 years in disadvantaged communities. It is an educational programme that promotes development through sport operating with the motto; "Play for fun, learn for life!"





